



Intermountain AmeriCorps SERVICE & EDUCATION TEAM (SET)

Service & Education Team (SET) members serve all age levels, anywhere from Kindergarten to adults in the community. The common goal is to improve the basic and essential skills of those they serve. A SET member is assigned to a certain site, where he or she focuses on students in a specific age range or grade level. Some members assist in the lower age levels (mostly in reading) and other members assist in high schools where they help in all subject areas and leadership classes. Some sites also focus on the adult skill building side of the spectrum, and we also have some sites that have a technology related focus. Across all grade levels, members serve a high percentage of students with limited English.

A SET member's day is typically divided into time for tutoring and mentoring activities, time for AmeriCorps related responsibilities and time for after school programs. Sites typically look to see what a members specific talents and skills are and try to work with them to help bring out those passions to those they serve. Many members get a lot of chances to develop programs in an after school setting that are based off of their strengths, skills and talents.



What you may be doing as a SET member (depending upon the site):

- *Provide students with tutoring and academic mentoring to increase their competence in study and organizational skills and also in grades and on tests.*
- *Assist students with limited English skills to improve their comprehension, fluency, vocabulary, pronunciation and grammar, and build communication skills.*
- *Educate students in citizenship skills such as leadership, peer mediation, and team building.*
- *Develop and implement service-learning projects, giving communities an opportunity to work together to address a community priority.*
- *Mentor youth to help them see their potential in life and help them build self-esteem.*
- *Expose youth to computer resources and provide the opportunity to use technology as a tool for learning.*
- *Provide computer-based learning opportunities to supplement/reinforce school curriculum in specific skill areas.*
- *And much more!*

The sites our SET members are located at are the YWCA, YMCA, Domestic & Sexual Violence Crisis Center (DSV), Foothills Middle School, Sterling Middle School, Grand Coulee School District, Head Start, Mainstreet Learning Center, Brewster Elementary School, Bridgeport School District, Cascade School District and Entiat School District.
