



# Intermountain AmeriCorps LOCATION INFORMATION

Intermountain AmeriCorps covers approximately 13,000 square miles of Chelan, Douglas, Okanogan and Grant counties in beautiful North Central Washington State. We are nestled in the rain shadow of the Cascade Mountains giving us close to 300 sunny days a year! Actually our area only gets about 8"-12" of annual precipitation. Our summer days are typically in the 80-90 degree range (with minimal to no humidity do to the limited precipitation), but our nights cool to an amazing 50-65 degrees. We get a range of seasons and even in May you still get to see snow up on the mountains but get the comfort of 60-degree weather!



We are in the middle of the state, about three hours East of Seattle and three hours West of Spokane. The most urban area is the Wenatchee Valley with a population of just over 50,000. The next most populated is Moses Lake with approximately 20,000. Many of the sites our members serve in are scattered rural communities. At least 50% of our members serve in the city of Wenatchee and the others are dispersed in the many rural communities surrounding the Wenatchee Valley.

Outdoor recreation is abound throughout North Central Washington from the wide-open space of the plateau regions to the towering and beautiful mountains and foothills. The Wenatchee valley and surrounding towns provide our members with much access to the outdoors and all the activities it encompasses! On the weekends you can take in the unique shops of a small rural town, go for a movie in Wenatchee, pack up your gear and go for an adventure in the mountains or even take a drive over to Seattle or Spokane to take in the city sites!



Our members come out to serve our communities and work hard during the year and as an organization we are very grateful and always happy to see our members exploring all that the Pacific Northwest has to offer during their free time.
